

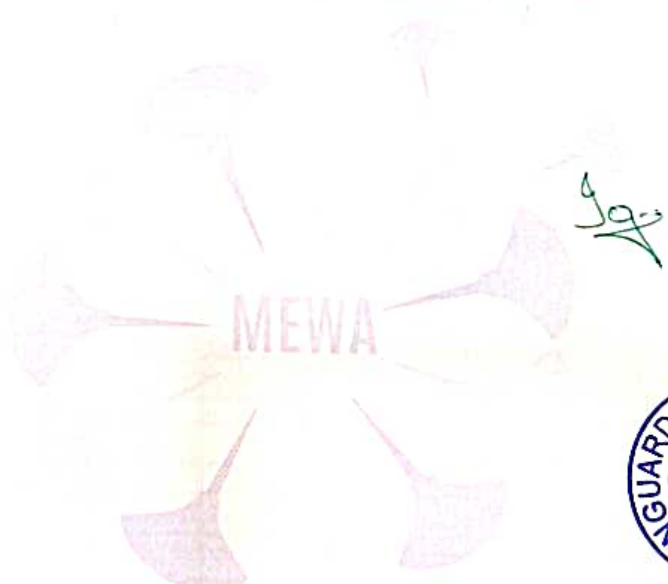

Management Aptitude Test and Test Scores

- The Management Aptitude Test (MAT) is designed to measure the aptitude of a candidate for pursuing management education and should be used only for this purpose.
- MAT is administered in five sections: Language Comprehension, Mathematical Skills, Data Analysis & Sufficiency, Intelligence & Critical Reasoning and Indian & Global Environment each section having a different ability related to management education.
- All MAT administrations use a variety of test formats. These test administrations may be slightly more difficult or less difficult than another. Scores may have to be taken into these differences.
- The scaled scores reported are relative based scores for respective sections. These scores are reported on a scale of 0 to 100. Extreme scores (above 15 or below 0) are rare.
- The percentile score reflects the percentage of candidates in the test who scored below that of the candidate in the section.
- The Composite score in an overall scaled score based on the first four sections of MAT. This is reported on a scale of 110 to 610.
- The percentile score for the Composite Score represents the percentage of candidates whose composite scores are below the candidate. The composite score has a variety of uses.
- All scores and percentile scores are reported after rounding off to the nearest whole number.
- Percentile data is reported by the candidate.
- The AIMA has taken due care while conducting the State Court. However, in case of any candidate's error, the AIMA reserves the right to verify the score at a later stage.
- Normalized scores across all test centers papers are based on the relative performance of all those who appeared for the examination. The raw scores reported are translated into Normalized Scores.
